

**AN ORDINANCE BY COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT/HUMAN RESOURCES COMMITTEE AMENDING ATLANTA CODE OF ORDINANCES SECTION 110-3 TO REVISE CERTAIN FEES RELATED TO AMENITIES AND PROGRAMS OFFERED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PARKS AND RECREATION; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.**

**(HELD 11/15/16 BY THE COMMITTEE TO ALLOW ALL NPU'S TO REVIEW AND FOR A PUBLIC HEARING SCHEDULED FOR 11/29/16.)**

WHEREAS, the City of Atlanta (“City”) Code of Ordinances, Section 110-3 (“Fee Schedule”) establishes a fee structure for individuals and groups wishing to utilize City amenities and participate in City programs, including classes and activities, offered by the Department of Parks and Recreation; and

WHEREAS, Section 110-3 of the Code lists specific picnic pavilions available for exclusive use reservation, and the list does not represent the City’s complete inventory of picnic pavilions; and

WHEREAS, Section 110-3 of the Code lists specific auditoriums available for exclusive use reservation, and the list does not represent the City’s complete inventory of auditoriums; and

WHEREAS, the Code, in its’ current state, does not adequately indicate a pricing method for newly constructed picnic pavilions or auditoriums; and

WHEREAS, Section 110-3 of the Code does not grant the ability to make outdoor basketball and volleyball courts available for exclusive use reservation; and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to restructure the Fee Schedule to better accommodate the current business processes and available inventory of the Department of Parks and Recreation.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, GEORGIA, HEREBY ORDAINS, as follows:

SECTION 1: Atlanta Code of Ordinances Section 110-3 entitled “Fee Schedule”, Subsection (e) entitled “Fees for use of city picnic pavilions are as follows:” setting forth rental fees for picnic pavilions, shall be amended by:

- (1) Eliminating the chart in Section 110-3(e)(1) listing certain, specific pavilions and their resident and non-resident reservation fees
- (2) Modifying Section 110-3(e)(1) to create a Small Pavilion category with a Resident fee of \$100 per day, and a Non-Resident fee of \$150 per day
- (3) Modifying Section 110-3(e)(1) to create a Medium Pavilion category with a Resident fee of \$150 per day, and a Non-Resident fee of \$200 per day

- (4) Modifying Section 110-3(e)(1) to create a Large Pavilion category with a Resident fee of \$200 per day, and a Non-Resident fee of \$300 per day
- (5) Modifying Section 110-3(e)(1) to create an X-Large Pavilion category with a Resident fee of \$300 per day, and a Non-Resident fee of \$400 per day
- (6) Eliminating the Section 110-3(e)(4) which mentions new pavilions
- (7) Modifying the remaining Sections' numeric order to reflect the removal of Section 110-3(e)(4)

Section 110-3(e) shall now read as follows (bold indicates a new or changed fee):

(e) Fees for use of city picnic pavilions are as follows:

(1) The following reservation fees:

a. Small Pavilions

1. City Residents \$100.00 per day
2. Non-City Residents \$150.00 per day

b. Medium Pavilions

1. City Residents \$150.00 per day
2. Non-City Residents \$200.00 per day

c. Large Pavilions

1. City Residents \$200.00 per day
2. Non-City Residents \$300.00 per day

d. X-Large Pavilions

1. City Residents \$300.00 per day
2. Non-City Residents \$400.00 per day

- (2) A refundable sanitation bond of \$100.00 will be charged to reserve the referenced pavilions, payable two weeks prior to the date of the reservation date. The bond shall be forfeited to the city if reserving party fails to clean the pavilions and deposit trash in the trash receptacles provided by the city prior to leaving the site.
- (3) City park users who reserve pavilions shall have the option of using park attendants at the rate of \$10.50 per hour at all designated parks. The commissioner of the department of parks, recreation, and cultural affairs shall have the authority to provide this option and charge this fee at other city parks at her discretion.
- (4) Wedding fee: Where an outdoor wedding occurs inside a city park, in a location other than in a picnic pavilion, and where the wedding includes set-up or requires city services, the organizer shall be required to pay a fee of \$50.00.
- (5) City park users requesting a permit to utilize specific areas of park greenspace shall be required to pay a fee of \$50.00. Large gathering permit holders shall be exempt from this permit fee.
- (6) City park users who reserve the amphitheater at Historic Fourth Ward Park shall be required to pay an additional fee of \$50.00 per hour if an electrical source is required. The fee is charged during set-up, the duration of the event and break down.

(7) City park users requesting permission to use amplified sound, portable toilets, banners, tents 10' × 10' or larger, or generators shall pay a Special Use Fee of \$50.00.

SECTION 2: Atlanta Code of Ordinances Section 110-3 entitled “Fee Schedule”, Subsection (d)(11) entitled “*Tennis Fees:*”, setting forth rental fees for Tennis Courts, shall be amended by:

- (1) Modifying Section 110-3(d)(11) to describe “*Outdoor Court Fees*” rather than “*Tennis Fees*”
- (2) Modifying the chart in Section 110-3(d)(11) to appear as an outline rather than a chart
- (3) Eliminating the “*Hour and One Half*” language in Section 110-3(d)(11)b., due to its’ contradiction of the “*Hourly*” fees.

Section 110-3(d)(11) shall now read as follows (bold indicates a new or changed fee):

(11) *Outdoor Court Fees:* For purposes of this section regarding outdoor court fees. Primetime shall mean after 6:00 pm on Weekdays and all times on Weekends and Nationally-observed holidays. All other times shall be deemed Non-Primetime.

SECTION 3: Atlanta Code of Ordinances Section 110-3 entitled “Fee Schedule”, Subsection (a) entitled “Miscellaneous Rental Fees:” setting forth rental fees for various types of equipment and facilities, shall be amended by:

- (1) Modifying Section 110-3(a) to describe “Reservation Fees” rather than “Miscellaneous Rental Fees”
- (2) Eliminating Section 110-3(a)(1) due to the Gilbert House being organized under the Office of Recreation, and therefore not requiring dedicated language
- (3) Modifying the charts in Section 110-3(a)(2) and 110-3(a)(3) to appear as outlines rather than as charts
- (4) Eliminating all references to charges for Tables and Chairs throughout Section 110-3(a)
- (5) Modifying Section 110-3(a)(4) to create a category for Auditoriums, rather than various price points for specific auditoriums

- (6) Modifying Section 110-3(a)(4) to reduce the Resident Individual rate for gymnasiums and eliminate the 4 hour minimum language.
- (7) Eliminating Section 110-3(a)(5) due to the Cyclorama no longer being a City of Atlanta program, and therefore not requiring any language
- (8) Adding to Section 110-3(a) a section governing Playmobile reservations
- (9) Adding to Section 110-3(a) a section governing Batting Cage reservations
- (10) Adding to Section 110-3(a) a section governing Birthday Party event packages

Section 110-3(a) shall now read as follows (bold indicates a new or changed fee):

(a) Reservation Fees: For purposes of this Section 110-3(a), "tax-exempt organization" shall mean any organization described in the Internal Revenue Service's list of organizations that qualify for 501(c)(3) or 501(c)(4) status, regardless of whether the organization has actually applied for and/or received such 501(c)(3) or 501(c)(4) designation.

(1) *Showmobile rental (per 8 hour period)*

(6) *Recreation Center Rooms* - The City of Atlanta owns three different types of recreation centers. A Class 4 recreation center has a full gymnasium and a natatorium. A Class 3 recreation center has a full gymnasium but no natatorium. A Class 2 recreation center does not have a full gymnasium or a natatorium. The rates for recreation center rooms are set forth below.

(a) *Recreation Center room hourly rates, per room* - These rates apply to multipurpose, classroom, dance, art, and computer lab room rentals.

(c) *Conference room hourly rates, per room* - These rates apply to conference rooms. Except tables and chairs, use of city equipment shall not be permitted with conference room rentals.

(d) *Gymnasium hourly rates, per room* - These rates apply to gymnasium rentals. Use of city equipment, chairs and/or tables shall not be permitted with gymnasium rentals.

4. Resident tax-exempt organizations \$88.00

(e) *Neighborhood Planning Unit Neighborhood Associations* - During regular operating hours, and pending availability, rooms will be made available, free of charge, to Booster Clubs that are registered with the Department of Parks and Recreation, NPU and Neighborhood Planning Unit Neighborhood Associations, and NPU Sub-Committees that are registered as such with the Department of Planning and Community Development, and that are conducting organizational and community business meetings and activities. Additionally, pending availability, there shall be no charge for the use of city equipment (excluding office supplies) used in connection with said meetings. The charge for such meetings that occur outside of operating hours, pending availability, shall be the applicable rate for Resident tax-exempt organizations. The use of city equipment (excluding office supplies) shall remain free of charge.

(f) *Event Packages*

1. *Weddings and wedding receptions* - Any individual or organization wishing to hold a wedding or wedding reception at a Class 4 recreation center shall be charged \$750.00 total for use of its' Auditoriums. This rental shall entitle the renter to seven hours of use, including a maximum of four hours for the event itself, two hours for set up, and one hour for break down. Any additional hours of use will be billed at \$187.50 per hour. Weddings and wedding receptions may not be held in conference rooms or the gymnasiums.

2. *Events with admission fees/vending* - Any individual or organization holding an event at a Class 4 Recreation Center where attendants are charged an admission fee, and/or where vending occurs, must pay:

i. The applicable facility rates set forth above, and

ii. 20% of the gross revenue collected at the event or \$500.00, whichever is greater.

3. *Birthday Parties* - Any individual or organization wishing to hold a birthday party at a Recreation Center shall be charged \$110.00 total for use of its' Classroom and Gymnasium. This rental shall entitle the renter to two and a half hours of use, including one hour of classroom access, one hour of organized play in the gymnasium led by a Fun Expert, and thirty minutes for set-up prior to the event. Birthday parties cannot exceed thirty youth.

(g) *Salary surcharge and security requirements*

1. *Salary surcharge* - In addition to all of the rates set forth above in this subsection (a)(6), the renter of any recreation center or portion thereof shall be required to pay a salary surcharge for those times when the rental occurs outside of operating hours of the recreation center. The salary surcharge shall be applied to any and all renters using a facility, including without limitation Booster Clubs, NPU's, and Neighborhood Planning Unit Neighborhood Association Sub-Committees. The salary surcharge shall be

\$25.00 per hour for each staff person required. One staff person shall be provided for every 100 persons whom the Department of Parks and Recreation reasonably expects to attend, such that 1 - 100 anticipated attendees shall require one staff person; 101 - 200 anticipated attendees shall require two staff people, etc. The number of expected attendees shall be based upon the number provided on the permit. The Department of Parks and Recreation may apply a different number where it has reasonably reliable information that more attendees will be present, where it provides that information and the decision to the applicant in writing, and where it gives the applicant an opportunity to refute the information.

2. *Security requirement* - The renter of all or a portion of a recreation center must provide off-duty POST-certified law enforcement officers during the rental, regardless of whether the rental occurs during regular or non-regular operating hours if the Department of Parks and Recreation reasonably expects that the number of attendees will be greater than 75, the event is a party or other gathering for social purposes (i.e. not a meeting), where the Department of Parks and Recreation reasonably expects that the event will be attended primarily by persons under the age of 21 years, the event involves the serving of alcohol, or the Department of Parks and Recreation and the Atlanta Police Department both reasonably determine that security is required because of the nature of the event to protect the safety of persons and/or property. The number of security personnel required shall be one officer for every 75 anticipated attendees or less (1 - 75 anticipated attendees shall require one officer; 76 - 150 anticipated attendees shall require two officers, etc.), unless the Atlanta Police Department decides that a greater ratio of security personnel is required to protect the safety of persons and/or property. The Department of Parks and Recreation shall establish in writing the procedure for ascertaining that the renter has met the security requirements established by the Department of Parks and Recreation and/or the Atlanta Police Department for the rental. To the extent that this subsection (g)(2) requires that a discretionary decision be made by the Department of Parks and Recreation and/or the Atlanta Police Department, the decision must be made based upon reasonably reliable information, that information and decision must be provided to the applicant in writing, and the applicant must be given an opportunity to refute the information. In no event shall the basis of the discretionary decision be the applicant or attendees' race, color, creed, religion, gender, domestic relationship status, parental status, familial status, sexual orientation, national origin, political affiliation, gender identity, or disability status.

SECTION 4: Atlanta Code of Ordinances Section 110-3 entitled "Fee Schedule", Subsection (d)(1)a. entitled "*Adult athletic team registration fees:*", setting forth participation fees for Adult Athletics Programming, shall be amended by:

- (1) Modifying Section 110-3(d)(1)a. to reduce the "Basic Registration (per season), per team" fee from \$600.00 to \$375.00

Section 110-3(d)(1)a. shall now read as follows (bold indicates a new or changed fee):

(1) *Athletic fees:*

a. *Adult athletic team registration fees:*

- i. Basic registration (per season), per team \$375.00
- ii. Single elimination tournament fee, per team \$150.00
- iii. Double elimination tournament fee, per team \$200.00



SECTION 5: Atlanta Code of Ordinances Section 110-3 entitled “Fee Schedule”, Subsection (d)(4) entitled “*Teen Club Fee:*”, setting forth participation fees for Atlanta Teen Leaders Programming, shall be amended by:

- (1) Modifying Section 110-3(d)(4) to reduce the “*Teen Club Fee:* per year, per person” fee from \$50.00 to \$5.00

Section 110-3(d)(4) shall now read as follows (bold indicates a new or changed fee):

- (4) *Teen Club Fee:* per year, per person \$5.00

SECTION 6: Atlanta Code of Ordinances Section 110-3 entitled “Fee Schedule”, Subsection (d)(10) entitled “*Senior Program Fee:*”, setting forth participation fees for Prime Time Seniors Programming, shall be amended by:

- (1) Modifying Section 110-3(d)(10)(a) to reduce the “Resident, per person, per year” fee from \$45.00 to \$25.00
- (2) Modifying Section 110-3(d)(10)(b) to reduce the “Non-resident, per person, per year” fee from \$55.00 to \$45.00

Section 110-3(d)(10)(a) shall now read as follows (bold indicates a new or changed fee):

- (10) *Senior Program Fee:*
  - (a) Resident, per person, per year \$25.00
  - (b) Non-resident, per person, per year \$45.00

SECTION 7: Atlanta Code of Ordinances Section 110-3 entitled “Fee Schedule”, Subsection (f) entitled “The fees to be paid to the city for aquatics programs, pool use and pool rentals shall be as follows:”, setting forth membership and pool entry fees, shall be amended by:

- (1) Modifying Section 110-3(f)(1) to add online Red Cross certification classes to the list of onsite courses
- (2) Modifying the remaining Section 110-3(f) to appear as an outline rather than as a chart
- (3) Modifying Section 110-3(f)(4) to replace the various Pool Entrance Fees based on age with a single \$5.00 fee
- (4) Modifying Section 110-3(f)(5)b. to reduce the Non-resident rate from \$185.00 to \$150.00
- (5) Modifying Section 110-3(f)(5)c. to reduce the Non-resident rate from \$470.00 to \$345.00
- (6) Eliminating all references to charges for Tables and Chairs throughout Section 110-3(f)

Section 110-3(f) shall now read as follows (bold indicates a new or changed fee):

(f) The fees to be paid to the city for aquatics programs, pool use and pool rentals shall be as follows:

For those City pools that are operated by a private entity, the private entity may establish its own entrance fees to be applied only when City-operated pools are closed to the public. The entity's entrance fees shall be approved through the entity's MOU with the City.

For those City pools that are operated by a private entity, the private entity may establish its own summer pass fees to be applied only when City-operated pools are closed to the public. The entity's summer pass fees shall be approved through the entity's MOU with the City.
